

A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR...

Lately, you've probably noticed a lot of people gathering signatures in public areas. The reason is there are big policies that are taking place in our state this upcoming election in the Fall.

Bear with me for a short story. One such person was at a gas station when a brother priest (who was wearing plain clothing) was approached. The young man with the



petition said he was gathering signatures to ensure women's reproductive rights to ensure the right to abortions early on in the pregnancy. The priest asked to see the paper and point out that it read "Fetal viability ... without the application of extraordinary medical measures," could mean babies born as late as 36 weeks (the start of the 9th month of pregnancy) would fit that description. The young man said that's not possible and called his employer. The employer assured the young man that it was for early abortions. The priest pointed out that what the young man was told does not match what the petition states. In the end, that shook up the young petitioner. Even he didn't know the full extent of what he was doing.

At our parish, we've had flyers, signature collections over a few weeks, and bulletin inserts as ways to help educate. But to help one last time, this weekend we will have Tom Venzor, a speaker from the Nebraska Catholic Conference. This organization advocates for the public policy priorities of the Catholic Church and advance the Gospel of Life through engaging, educating, and empowering public officials, the Catholic faithful, and the general public.

For the coffee and donuts, the speaker will be available to ask questions about what's all going on.

NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS

As you may have heard, there is a National Eucharistic Revival going on across the United States! The bishops discerned and called for this movement to take place from 2022-2025. Right now there are four cross country pilgrimages processing across the United States, coming from the North (Minnesota), South (Texas), East (Connecticut), and West (California). These four will all converge at the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, Indiana, on July 17th in a powerful symbol of unity, marking the first National Eucharistic Congress in 83 years. Between the four processions there are over 1,000 host locations, 6,500 miles, and 100,00 participants

This is in response to God's invitation for renewal, calling on the Holy Spirit to bring the flame through local communities and blaze together at the Eucharistic Congress in July. All four branches of the pilgrimage will join in procession to bring Jesus into the stadium, where tens of thousands of pilgrims will be gathered together to welcome Jesus at the end of his cross—country journey and open our hearts to what God has in store for us.

Then, gathered as one Church, we will present our wounded and imperfect hearts to the triune God who loves us. Just as He did on the road to Emmaus, Our Lord will listen to our worries and reveal himself once more in the breaking of the bread.

One of our parishioners, Phyllis Kool, will be present at the congress and in the stadium that night. This is an extension of her Lincoln Diocese Eucharistic Pilgrimage, which she completed in September, traveling from one end of the Diocese to the other, visiting our Eucharistic Lord in times of adoration at parishes all across the diocese.

Phyllis will bring any intentions of our parishioners with her to the stadium and offer them up to Jesus for you. Please write down any intentions you might have, put them in a sealed envelope, and submit them in the drop box outside of the parish office by *Wednesday*, *July 3rd*.

If it is more convenient, she will also accept intentions via email. Email Phyllis Kool (phyllis5665@icloud.com) with "Eucharistic Intentions" in the subject line, and then without reading the intentions, she will place them in a folder and present them to Jesus via her phone. These online intentions need to be send to Phyllis by *Tuesday*, *July 16th*.
